

What should I already know?

- Christians believe in and follow God.
- Gospels are the stories of Jesus life—the four Gospels were written by the disciples Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.
- Jesus encouraged people to join him—he 'fished for men', so that he could teach them how to lead a better life. These people were called disciples.
- Know the word 'Baptism' and have a basic understanding of it's significance for Christians.

Key Vocabulary and Definitions	
Trinity	God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
God, the Holy Spirit	The 3rd person of the Trinity. A part of God.
God the Father	God– Creator of the universe, father of Jesus.
God, the Son	Jesus has always existed, but became human (incarnated) for a time.
Gospel	The teaching or revelation of Christ.
Christian	A religious person, who believes in Christianity.






Key questions
