Geography—Learning about the Earth and everything on

Human features—Things that are created, built or changed by humans

Physical features—Things that have formed by nature.

United Kingdom—One country made up of 4 smaller countries (England, Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland).

Country—Land that is controlled by a single government (leaders and rule makers)

Capital city—City from which a government runs a country.

Seas—Bodies of salt water near land.

Map—A picture of land or sea showing land features, cities, roads, etc.

Key—Explains what symbols and colours on a map mean.

Compass—Navigation instrument with a pointer showing the direction of North.

Local area—Everything near to where you live.

Route—Directions taken to get from one place to another

Birds eye view—A view from above.



Journeys are planned by finding quick and safe routes on maps. Directions are drawn on maps and described by using compass points, street names and landmarks.

Grids are used to find and describe places or features on maps. They can be separated into squares, which line up with a letter and number.

For example, the hippo is in D3
