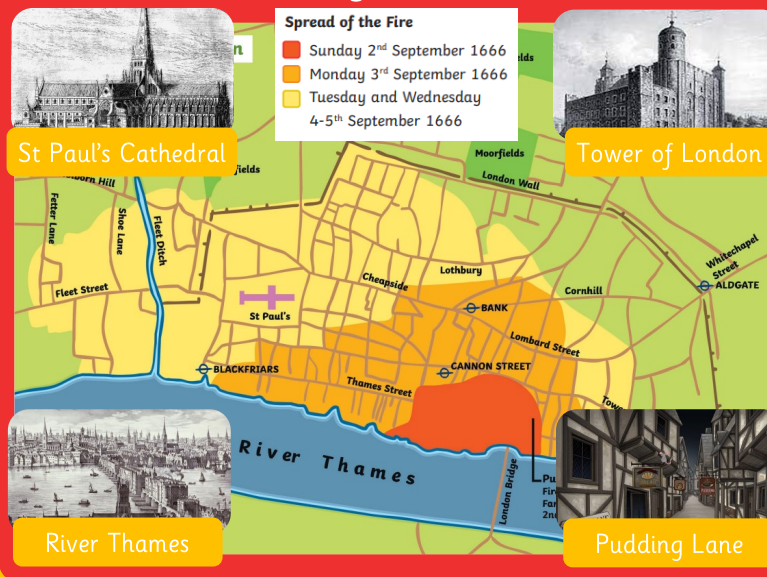


Key Vocabulary

- History**—Learning about the past.
- Timeline**—Shows a period of time with key events marked on it.
- Chronological**—Events shown in order of when they happened.
- Artefacts**—Man made objects used to find out about the past.
- Research**—Study and investigate to learn more about something.
- Sources**—Information that tells us about the past, E.g. letters, diaries, photos, artwork, artefacts.
- Impact**—How important people or key events have affected the future.
- Century**—A period of 100 years.
- Disaster**—A sudden event that causes lots of damage.
- Flammable**—Something that is easily set on fire.
- Diary**—A written record of a person's personal experiences.
- Fire hooks**—Long stick with hook on the end to pull down walls.
- Monument**—A structure, such as a statue, built to remember something or someone.
