Geography—Learning about the Earth.

Human features—Things that are made or changed by humans

Physical features—Things that have been formed by nature.

Local area—Everything near to where you live

Map—A picture of land or sea showing land features, cities, roads, etc.

Key—Explains what symbols and colours on a map mean.

Country—Land that is controlled by a single government
(leaders and rule makers)

Seas—Bodies of salt water.

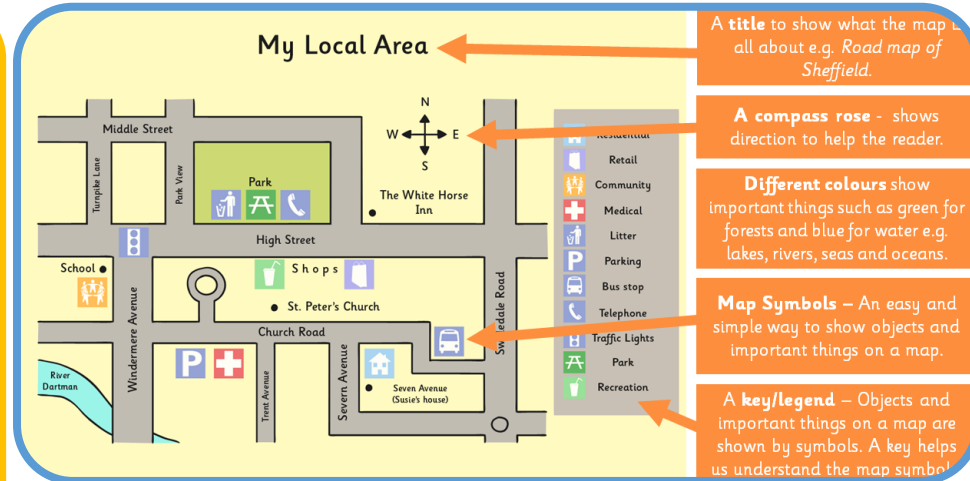
Continents—The world's main parts of land made up of lots of countries.

United Kingdom (U.K)—Single country made up of 4 smaller countries (England, Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland).

Compass—An navigation instrument with a pointer, which shows the direction of north.

Route—Directions taken to get from one place to another

Maps cannot possibly show everything! They are drawn to 'scale'! Imagine drawing a map of that Earth that was full size!



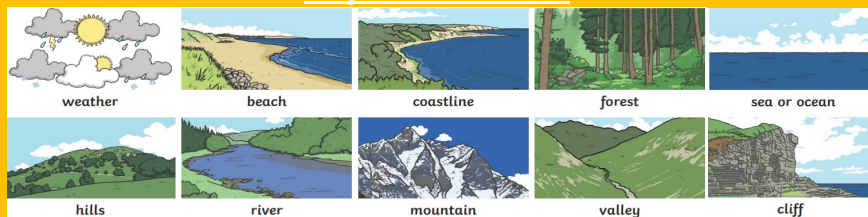
Planning a route
