Easter Traditions


Many Christians go to church at Easter. Parts of the Bible are read and special hymns are sunq.

Lent

Time of new beginnings and to get fit to live a Christian life

Period of time leading up to Easter

Lasts for 40 days (excluding Sundays)

Begins on Ash Wednesday





Good Friday

- Christians remember the day Jesus was crucified.
- Christians believe it is a 'good' day as Jesus died for the sins of others.
- When he died his body was put in a stone tomb and blocked by a huge, heavy boulder.

Easter Sunday

- When Christians celebrate the resurrection of Jesus.
- His friends went to his tomb and were surprised to find his body was gone.
- His resurrection gives Christians the promise of eternal life in heaven.

Palm Sunday

- The start of Holy Week. Christians remember when Jesus rode into Jerusalem.
- People welcomed him by waving palm leaves and placed them on the ground in front of him.
- Palm leaves symbolise goodness and wellbeing.

The Last Supper

- When Jesus met with his disciples for the last time.
- Jesus knew this would be their last meeting and that one of them would betray him.
- He gave them all some bread to represented his body and some wine to represented his blood.
