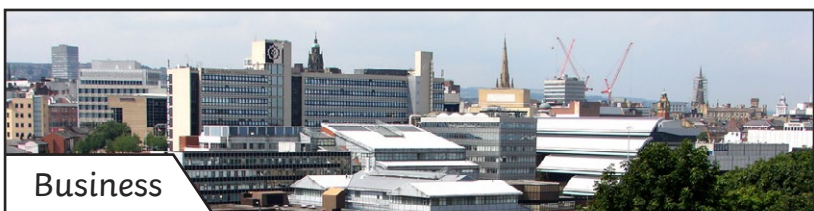

Retail	To sell products to people.

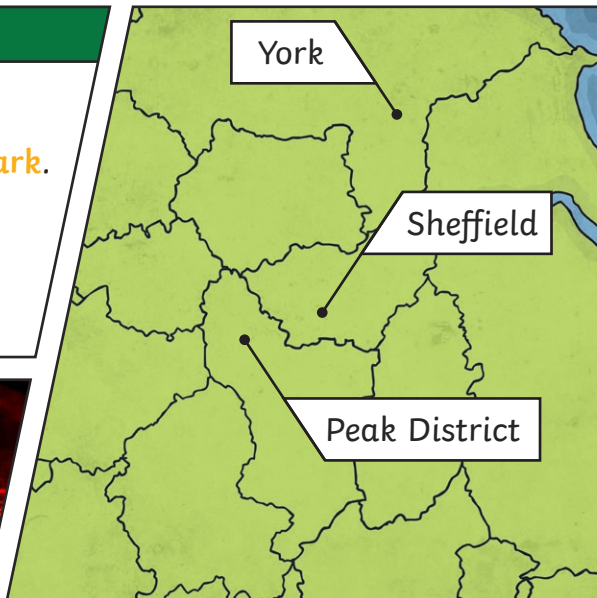
